II. Reading of Reports:

A. Head of Charter Organization: No Report.

B. Troop Committee Chair: Informed committee of new BSA requirement for all adult leaders to physically sign background check releases or else they will not be allowed on the charter. Rechartering will be starting shortly and reminder that any adult who will attend more than 4 camp nights will need to be added to the charter (all adults attending overnights require YPT to participate).

C. Troop Secretary:

D. Scoutmaster: M. Russo presented the SM update:

- Clay shooting event: good event; club offered to let the scouts shoot for free if they helped with planting in Spring. Consider combining with camping at Baiting Hollow.
- Catamount trip: patrol lunch at Catamount worked out well. Taconic Park was closeby and the facilities were fine (\$28/site). Nooteeming campsite has reportedly addressed their bug issues and could be a potential campsite for the next Catamount trip.

E. Troop Treasurer:

- Scoutmaster Russo provided cost analysis of last year's trips:
 - o tent trips @ \$25 we are typically over our costs by \$0-5: site @ \$5, cars @ \$10, and food @ \$13
 - o cabin trips @ \$25 we are typically over our costs by \$20-25.
 - Other troops don't charge the same price for cabin as tent trips
 - Committee agreed to raise the price of all trips after Alpine by \$5 and reconsider raising the annual renewal fee next year (in addition to increased national program cost)

F. Fundraiser Coordinator:

• J. Chin indicated that this year's popcorn sales will be all handled electronically with purchases delivered by the vendor rather than by pickup and delivery by scouts.

G. Outdoor Activities Coordinator:

- Holiday party choices: bowling, rock climbing, and Bounce. To be raised at next greenbar
- 2019 Summer Camp photo for the HCC display is still missing from Onteora
- Wreath pickup will be at 11/23 and set price of \$12 (this was the new price set last year). J. Chin and C. Zgombic have volunteered to coordinate.
- Alpine trip: approximately 19 scouts and 12 adults have registered. All adults require YPT training to stay overnight.
- M. Pavlidis contacted the Coast Guard at Jones Beach there is construction happening and will be better in September.
- Scoutmaster Russo to ask at the next greenbar meeting if there is interest in any high adventure trips this summer (e.g., Seabase, Northern Tier, Summit)
