## **B.** Troop Committee Chair:

• Troop fees need to be finalized. There were no responses from parents following the August 15<sup>th</sup> email regarding plans for the 2020-2021 scout year. Therefore, it was agreed that Troop membership fees will be \$175 for all returning scouts, scouts moving up from cub scouts, or scouts transferring from another troop. Any boys new to scouting will pay \$200 which includes the \$25 registration surcharge BSA national is imposing.

We will follow our "Before We Gather" protocols which include temperature checks, answering a COVID-19 questionnaire, always wearing face masks, maintaining social distance and participants bringing their own hand sanitizer.
- The American Legion Hall is allowing us to conduct our Troop and Greenbar meetings in their rear courtyard. Due to limited daylight all meetings will start at 6:00 pm. In case of inclement weather and email/remind text will be send and the meeting will be conducted virtually via Zoom
